TEXTS: Isaiah 52:7-12

AIMS:

i. to study the concept of buckled shoes for gospel of peace

INTRODUCTION

The buckled shoes of a Roman soldier help in navigating rough terrain, unlike other foot-wears. In our text today, prophet Isaiah proclaimed the freedom of the Jews from the land of slavery and the nature of the carrier of this good news. As PILGRIMS TO HEAVENLY KINGDOM, having our feet fitted with the shoes of the gospel of peace allow us to be ready to always preach the gospel message to the world around us. The importance of peace in the life of a Pilgrim is to always advance onto the battlefield unafraid, because we carry with us the good news of Jesus' death and resurrection for the salvation of the world. Therefore, as Pilgrims, we should always be prepared to spread the good News of salvation when convenient and when inconvenient.

THIS MONTH IN THE HISTORY OF THE CATHEDRAL - NOVEMBER

- By Church History Sub-Committee

1924

Nov. 3 First available record of Assize Service at the Cathedral. Previous ones dating back to 1909 were reported to have been followed by a colourful procession to the Supreme Court in Tinubu Square led by the Lagos Constabulary and a mounted guard.

1933

Nov. 7 Setting up of a committee to write the history of the Church from materials collected by Canon M.S. Cole.

1935

SOUL FOOD 46/2023 Gleaners' Harvest 2023 ASSURED FRUITLNESS: IN CHRIST ALONE

"I am the vine; you are the branches. If you remain in me and I in you, you will bear much fruit; apart from me, you can do nothing." John 15:5

Today, we conclude our 2023 Harvest celebrations with the Gleaners' Harvest, when we not only give thanks for the year's harvest but also reflect on the divine mandate of sharing God's blessings with all His children. First, we thank the Almighty God for the hands that have toiled – through the instrumentality of the host society – the Young Women Christ Association (YWCA), for the soil that has given – through our special guests and all of us who have had hands in making 2023 Harvest successful, and for the sunshine and rain that have nourished our efforts – via the divine help that we have enjoyed.

Most importantly, we also thank God for the spirit of generosity and compassion that has moved through our Cathedral and has propelled us to uphold and continue in this rich tradition in obedience to the injunction of the Lord - the tradition which is a living testimony to our faith - a faith that believes in action, a faith that sees the face of Christ in the least of our brothers and sisters. We would recall that Jesus identifies Himself with this category in society - the hungry, the thirsty, the stranger, the naked, the sick, and the prisoner. "For I was hungry, and you fed me. I was thirsty, and you

gave me a drink. I was a stranger, and you invited me into your home. I was naked, and you gave me clothing. I was sick, and you cared for me. I was in prison, and you visited me." (Matthew 25: 35ff)

At this service and in the context of our Gleaners' Harvest, we stand in the shadows of ancient fields where the Israelites once walked, following behind the reapers, gathering what was left for the widow, the orphan, and the strangers as commanded in the Torah: "When you reap the harvest of your land, do not reap to the very edges of your field or gather the gleanings of your harvest. Do not go over your vineyard a second time or pick up the grapes that have fallen. Leave them for the poor and the foreigner. I am the Lord your God." (Leviticus 19:9-10) "When you are harvesting in your field, and you overlook a sheaf, do not go back to get it. Leave it for the foreigner, the fatherless and the widow so that the Lord your God may bless you in all the work of your hands." (Deuteronomy 24:19)

The law of gleaning, as outlined in the scriptures, was not merely an act of charity but a mandate of justice, a provision for the poor what was their right, and a command of God. It is fitting, then, that we should honour this tradition, for it reminds us that in the Kingdom of God, no one is to be forgotten, no one is to be left behind. The fruits of the earth are to be shared, and the blessings of the harvest are to be enjoyed by all. This is the essence of our gathering here today. We gather the gleanings of our harvest to administer it to the less privileged of our society.

Today, we might not glean fields as of old, but we apply the principle to ensure that those less fortunate have access to the necessities of life. In the Cathedral, our Gleaners, with baskets and hearts wide open, daily await the remnants of our abundance through the Social Welfare Service Unit - which attends to a myriad of clients with diverse needs such as education scholarships, medical bills, monthly maintenance allowance to indigent elders and invalid, the Five Loaves Initiative that feeds the indigents of our community monthly, the Cathedral Pantry that provides foodstuffs to members and non-members, and the Cathedral Clinic, where we administer treatment *gratis* to the community. The essence of this practice is to show our interconnectedness and the fact that we are all gleaners in the field of life, and we are all called to share the harvest, ensuring that our abundance or excess does not go to waste but becomes a source of sustenance for those who hunger. The parable of the rich fool told in Luke 12:13-21 is handy now. It tells of a man who, after a bountiful harvest, decides to tear down his barns to build larger ones to store all his grain and goods. He then says to himself that he will take life easy, eating, drinking, and being merry. However, God says to him, "You fool! This very night, your life will be demanded from you. Then who will get what you have prepared for yourself?" Jesus concludes the parable by saying, "This is how it will be with whoever

As we rejoice over the success of the 2023 Harvest, let us open our hearts to the challenges that lie ahead, considering the economic hardship of the present times, which has multiplied the number of those who rely on the church for sustenance. We must always be cognisant of them. Deuteronomy 15:11 says: "There will always be poor people in the land. Therefore, I command you to be openhanded toward your fellow Israelites who are poor and needy in your land."

stores up things for themselves but is not rich toward God." Implicit in this parable is a call to be generous, especially to people experiencing poverty. Wealth in our hands must be a tool used for the well-being of all,

We have discovered from the theme of this year's harvest that our fruitfulness is intertwined with our connectedness to Christ. As branches, we are not self-sufficient; our strength, life, and ability to bear fruit come from the vine - Christ Himself. In a world often concerned with scarcity, Jesus Christ offers us a gospel of abundance. He assures us that in Him, our work is not in vain, and our labour is not fruitless. As we glean the fields of life, let us remember that it is by remaining in Christ that our efforts are blessed, our baskets are filled, and our barns are overflowing. In Christ, we find the fullness of life. In John 15:5, Jesus says, "I am the vine; you are the branches. If you remain in me and I in you, you will bear much fruit; apart from me, you can do nothing."

As we celebrate this Gleaners Harvest Thanksgiving Service, may our hearts be attuned to the divine rhythm of sowing and reaping, and may we find joy in the assurance that our fruitfulness is secure in Christ alone.
