INTRODUCTION

The doctrine of sin is central to Christianity, since It is an immoral act considered to be a transgression of divine law and its basic message is about redemption in Christ. Overcoming sin starts by realizing the fact that our body has been purchased by God, and through Christ's redemption, you can have the power to live in victory over sin. Our Bible passage today clearly exposed us to the fact that only those in Christ Jesus, who had been born of the Spirit have the power over sin and carnalities of this world.

10. Free Will

11. The Justification of Man

We are accounted righteous before God solely on account of the merit of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ through faith and not on account of our own good works or of what we deserve. Consequently the teaching that we are justified by faith alone is a most wholesome and comforting doctrine. This is taught more fully in the homily on Justification.

"And in this way, with many other exhortations, John proclaimed the good news to the people." Luke 3:18

As the day of the coming of the Lord Jesus Christ draws nearer, it becomes increasingly important for believers to fulfil their assignment of spreading the Good News of His redemptive works. This will help prepare those who are not yet part of the fold for the imminent establishment of Christ's kingdom. In doing so, more people can receive the eternal salvation that Jesus purchased with His lifeblood. 2 Peter 3:9 says: "The Lord is not slack concerning his promise, as some men count slackness; but is longsuffering to us-ward, not willing that any should perish, but that all should come to repentance."

According to Scripture, faith in Jesus Christ as Lord and Savior is what assures eternal salvation when Jesus returns. To achieve this, one needs to make a personal commitment to turn away from sin and lead a life of devotion to God. John the Baptist called upon the Jewish people to repent of their sins and be baptised, which was an outward manifestation of their inward dedication to God through immersion in water. As Christians, we are also called to follow in John the Baptist's footsteps and urge this generation to repent of their sins and be prepared for the second coming of Jesus.

Jesus instructed His disciples in what is known as the Great Commission to go out and make disciples of all nations. This involved baptising them in the name of the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, as well as teaching them to obey all of Jesus' commands. In a similar vein, John the Baptist was assigned to prepare the way for Jesus' first coming by making it clear to the Jews that their ancestral heritage alone would not be enough to save them. John needed to ensure that the path to salvation was made straight and that the Jews understood this important truth.

John's belief in his role as preparatory, to make people aware of the Messiah's coming and the need to be spiritually prepared, continues to inspire us today. We, too, must understand our role in preparing for His second coming by being spiritually prepared to fulfil the purpose of our calling of preparing others for eternal salvation. The Great Commission tells us how to do this, through sharing our salvation testimony, preaching the gospel, baptising new converts, and teaching the Word of God. That is, we are to replicate ourselves in the lives of those who respond to the message of Christ's salvation. Let us take up this noble task with enthusiasm, knowing that it can turn people's disobedient hearts to the law of love.

The main objective of Jesus' time on Earth was to save the lost according to God's plan. He came to seek and save those who were lost. As followers of Jesus, it is our duty to make His mission our own. We must spread the message of repentance and forgiveness of sins in the name of Jesus to all nations with the power of the Holy Spirit.

Frances J. Crosby summarised our assignment thus:

Rescue the perishing, care for the dying Snatch them in pity from sin and the grave Weep o'er the erring one, lift up the fallen Tell them of Jesus the Mighty to save

Rescue the perishing, care for the dying Jesus is merciful. Jesus will save

Though they are slighting him, still he is waiting
Waiting the penitent child to receive
Plead with them earnestly, plead with them gently
He will forgive if they only believe

Rescue the perishing; duty demands it Strength for thy labour the Lord will provide Back to the narrow way, patiently win them Tell the poor wanderer a Saviour has died

Every Christian has a divine responsibility to contribute towards spreading the message of Christ and preparing people for eternal salvation. Each one of us has a unique and significant role to play in fulfilling the Great Commission. It does not matter how rich, famous, intelligent, or influential you are, no other cause can compare to this life-transforming and world-changing calling from God. No matter how many accolades, honours, or achievements you receive, they cannot even come close to the importance of the commandment of Jesus Christ to help spread His message of love and forgiveness to every individual in every community, city, and country around the world, and make disciples of all nations.

We have received a precious gift: "the faith that was once for all entrusted to God's holy people" (Jude 1:3). Jesus' words in the Great Commission reveal the heart of God, who desires "all people to be saved and to come to a knowledge of the truth" (1 Timothy 2:4). The Great Commission compels us to share the good news until everyone has heard. Like the servants in Jesus' parable, we are to be about the business of the kingdom, making disciples of all nations: "He called his ten servants, and delivered them ten pounds, and said unto them, Occupy till I come" (Luke 19:13, KJV). Paul says: "This, then, is how you ought to regard us: as servants of Christ and as those entrusted with the mysteries God has revealed. Now it is required that those who have been given a trust must prove faithful." (1 Corinthians 4:1&2)

Let us join hands and inspire each other to prepare those around us for eternal salvation. With the help of the Almighty, we can spread the message of hope and redemption to those in need. May our actions henceforth reflect the love and compassion of God, as we strive to make a positive impact on the lives of those around us.
