THEME: THE CHRISTIAN RACE

SUB-THEME: Passion Sunday

TOPIC: The kingship of Jesus

TEXT: Luk 19:28-40

AIMS:

- i. to study the essence of proclaiming Jesus as king on earth
- ii. to discuss the repercussion of denying the kingship of Christ.

INTRODUCTION

The word Passion is from the Latin word patior, which also means, "to suffer, bear and endure". Literarily, the Passion Week means the week of Christ's fulfilment of His earthly mission. The week started with the triumphal entry of Jesus into Jerusalem, and ended with the crucifixion at Calvary. In this year's Passion Sunday, we are studying the kingship of Jesus. Despite riding on a colt, a symbol of humility, He was widely acknowledged as the expected King and Messiah on His journey to Jerusalem. He took over the charge of the temple by purifying it from profane habits. However, the attempts of the Pharisees to silence the crowd in the street and to stop Christ from the Temple cleansing were futile.

STUDY GUIDES

1. Define Passion Week. What can you learn from the kingship of Jesus Christ with reference to his riding on a colt? Luk 19:35 compare with Zech 9:9.
2. How can you describe the action of the Pharisees in Luk 19:39? Can we see this type of attitude in the Church of God today with reference to John 9:18-22?
3. How can we proclaim the kingship of Christ on earth? Matt 28:19; 2Tim 1:8.
4. What is the benefit of proclaiming the kingship of Christ and the repercussion of denying His kingship? Matt 10:32-33? Rom 10:9

CONCLUSION: Despite His lowly ride, the Pharisees still attempted to silence the crowd from acknowledging the kingship of Christ. As Christians, we may meet such oppositions on our earthly race while proclaiming the gospel; nevertheless, we should never stop nor be ashamed because no one can stop the Kingship of Jesus.

FOOD FOR THOUGHT: When Christ rules the heart, the mouth proclaims Him as King of kings.

SOUL FOOD 12/2024

PATIENCE AND HUMILITY:

The Must-Have Virtues for Restoration

***“...have the same mindset as Christ Jesus: Who, being in very nature God, did not consider equality with God something to be used to his own advantage; rather, he made himself nothing by taking the very nature of a servant, being made in human likeness. And being found in appearance as a man, he humbled himself by becoming obedient to death— even death on a cross! Therefore, God exalted him to the highest place and gave him the name that is above every name...” -
Philippians 2:5-9***

Today, Christians commemorate the Triumphal Entry of Jesus into Jerusalem, known as Palm Sunday in the liturgical calendar. This event offers profound insights into the virtues of patience and humility, particularly in the restoration and redemption of humankind. Therefore, we will examine the theme, “Patience and Humility: The Must-Have Virtues for Full Restoration,” to explore those virtues in more detail.

As mentioned in Scripture, the principle of Patience involves trusting in God's timing while maintaining confidence in His benevolence and reliability. It requires persevering through difficulties and opposition with a relentless spirit, demonstrating compassion and self-restraint even when provoked. On the other hand, Humility involves intentionally acknowledging one's limitations and reliance on God, prioritising the needs of others above oneself, and adopting a servant-like mentality that is receptive to God's plan.

In Philippians 2:5-9, Paul highlights the ultimate example of patience and humility in Jesus' incarnation and sacrificial death on the cross, which demonstrated selflessness, obedience, and a lowly spirit. He encourages believers to have the same mindset as Jesus Christ, who, “being in very nature God, did not consider equality with God something to be used to his own advantage; rather, he made himself nothing by taking the very nature of a servant, being made in human likeness.”

Jesus' entry into Jerusalem was the culmination of His years of ministry, teaching, healing, and performing miracles. His journey towards the city was a deliberate fulfilment of prophecy, particularly Zechariah 9:9. This prophecy foretells a king coming to Jerusalem, “gentle and riding on a donkey.” This act signals a patient unfolding of God's plan for salvation. Jesus did not rush to assert dominance or overthrow earthly powers through force. Instead, He showed a steady and unwavering commitment to a divine timeline.

The way Jesus entered Jerusalem by riding on a donkey is significant as it represents humility and peace. While earthly kings often make grand entrances with displays of power, Jesus chose a humble and peaceful way to enter the city. This aligns with his mission to serve others instead of being served. This act of humility teaches us an essential lesson in restoration: to serve others by prioritising their needs above our own. This also includes choosing paths that may appear lowly by worldly standards but are valuable in a spiritual sense. We should never forget Jesus' statement to His disciples in Luke 22 when a dispute arose among them on who is the greatest. He used Himself as an example of humility: “But I am among you as one who serves.” (Luke 22:27b).

The story of the triumphal entry is one of contrasts, and those contrasts contain applications to us believers. It is the story of the King who came as a lowly servant on a donkey, not a prancing steed, not in royal robes, but on the clothes of the poor and humble. Jesus Christ comes not to conquer by force as an earthly king but by love, grace, mercy, and His sacrifice for His people. His is not a kingdom of armies and splendour but of lowliness and servanthood. He conquers not nations but hearts and minds. His message is one of peace with God, not of temporal peace. If Jesus has made a triumphal entry into our hearts, He reigns there in peace and love. As His followers, we exhibit those same qualities, and the world sees the true King living and reigning in triumph in us.

To experience complete restoration, it is crucial to integrate patience and humility. Patience will serve as a shield that helps us endure life's challenging and refining processes without losing faith. It will teach us to wait for the Lord's timing and trust His plan. Humility will be a door that opens our hearts to receive God's grace. It enables us to acknowledge our limitations and weaknesses, allowing God to work deeply in our hearts, leading to genuine healing and full restoration.

As we continue the journey with the Lord in His passion, I urge us to aspire to patience and humility as our guiding principles for any effort to heal, reconcile, and restore. Proverbs 22:4 connects humility and patience with the fear of the Lord, stating that possessing these qualities results in riches, honour, and life. This suggests that humility and patience are not only moral virtues but also spiritual conditions that lead to blessings.

May our restoration and the blessings of Christ's passion never elude us. Amen.
