Bible Study Outline

THEME: THE CHRISTIAN RACE SUB-THEME: Easter Sunday TOPIC: New life in Christ Jesus TEXT: 2Cor 5:12-21

AIMS:

i. to study the concept of new life in Christ and

ii. to discuss the old livelihood in relation to the new life in Christ.

INTRODUCTION

We thank God for another Easter morning, a day to celebrate the victory of our Lord Jesus Christ over death.

In our Bible passage today, Paul exposed the fact that Christ died as an innocent person for the sins He never committed, just for our righteousness and salvation (2Cor 5:15, 21). He admonished us that the best way to acknowledge this maximum sacrifice of Christ is to continuously live like Him and in Him (2Cor 5:15-17.

"But Christ has indeed been raised from the dead, the firstfruits of those who have fallen asleep. For since death came through a man, the resurrection of the dead comes also through a man." -I Corinthians 15:20-21

Alleluia! Christ is risen. He is risen indeed. Alleluia!

Today, on Easter Sunday, we celebrate the triumph of our Lord Jesus Christ over death and hell. On Good Friday, when Jesus was crucified, suffered, died, and was buried, his enemies thought they had succeeded in putting an end to the Savior of the world. They even hired guards to prevent his disciples from approaching his body. However, God's promise that He would not abandon His holy one to decay was fulfilled when Christ rose from the dead. Death could not hold him captive, and he emerged victorious, restoring humankind to its rightful place.

Christ's resurrection is significant as it gives hope for complete restoration to humanity. In 1 Corinthians 15:17-20, the Apostle Paul emphasises that if Christ had not risen from the dead, the Christian faith would be meaningless, and believers would still be in their sins. However, since Christ has risen from the dead, becoming the first to conquer death, we can be assured that we, too, will experience resurrection in this life and the afterlife. In other words, we have the assurance that restoration is possible now and in the future. As a result, our theme is "Christ's Resurrection: Harbinger of Full Restoration".

In Romans 4:25, it is stated that He was delivered over to death for our sins and was raised to life for our justification. This justification is the first step toward restoring the relationship between God and humanity, ensuring that believers are seen as righteous before God because of Christ. "In him, we have redemption through his blood, the forgiveness of our trespasses, according to the riches of his grace ..." (Ephesians 1:7). The resurrection of Jesus serves as God's declaration that Christ's sacrificial death was sufficient for the atonement of sin.

The resurrection as a harbinger of restoration is also seen in Paul's submission in 2 Corinthians 5:17; he states that if anyone is in Christ, the new creation has come: The old has gone, the new is here! Through our faith, we are united with Christ, not just legally or intellectually but spiritually (2 Corinthians 4:14). This union means that when God looks at us, He sees Christ's righteousness and not our imperfections. We share in Christ's resurrection, having died with Him and now living with Him (Romans 6:8). This bond between believers and Christ can be compared to the union of marriage, where two individuals become joined, and their possessions are shared. We believers receive Christ's righteousness through this union with Him (1 Corinthians 1:30). Through this bond, we can walk in newness of life, connected to Jesus Christ through the Holy Spirit (Romans 6:4).

Thus, we are empowered to live a new life in the Spirit because of Christ's resurrection. Romans 8:11 says that if the Spirit of Him who raised Jesus from the dead is living in you, He who raised Christ from the dead will also give life to your mortal bodies because of His Spirit who lives in you. This new life is a foretaste of the complete restoration, where the redeemed will live in perfect harmony with God.

Most importantly, Christ's resurrection means we no longer have to fear death as He has triumphed over it. Paul writes: "O death, where is your victory? O death, where is your sting?" "The sting of death is sin, and the power of sin is the law. But thanks be to God, who gives us the victory through our Lord Jesus Christ! (1 Corinthians 15:55-57). Paul states, "For as in Adam all die, so in Christ all will be made alive." (1 Corinthians 15:22). This future resurrection

In place of chaos, there shall be peace, and we will live the victorious life we were created to have.

May the victory of Christ's resurrection permeate every area of our lives.
